

# Illustrating your Glossary Strategy

## Video 1 - Step 1

### **TEACHER**

Hi! Welcome to Step 1 of the Illustrating your Glossary strategy.

Step 1 of the Illustrating your Glossary Strategy is: Select and Space  
In this step you will select a word that you want to find an image for and then make a space for the image in your glossary.

Before we get started, let's make sure your Glossary is in Google Docs. If you have been using Checkvist for your Glossary, you need to export it to Google Docs. If you are unsure how to do this, please check the Tool video labeled "Export Your Notes."

### **STUDENT**

OK, I've exported my glossary into a Google Doc and now I'm going to see which words I want to find images for ... ah, here's one.

Krill. I think it would be helpful to have an image for this word. I don't understand what it means.

### **TEACHER**

Once you find a word that needs an image, make a space for the image. To do this, put your cursor at the end of the definition or translation if you have one, and press "return" a couple of times.

### **STUDENT**

OK, so I'll put my cursor here, and then I'll press return a couple of times. Now I have a space for my image. I see how this works.

### **TEACHER**

Nice! You selected a word that you didn't understand and made a space for an image.

Now you're ready to move on to Step 2 of the Illustrating your Glossary strategy – Choose and Add.
