

# Illustrating your Glossary Strategy

## Video 2 - Step 2

### **TEACHER**

Welcome to Step 2 of the Illustrating your Glossary strategy!  
Step 2 is: Choose and Add.

In this step you will find and add an image to the word in your glossary you didn't understand.  
Remember, the image you choose should help you better understand the meaning of the word.

For this step you will need a web browser so you can do an image search. We will be using Google Docs because it has a built-in image search.

To start, put your cursor in the space you just made.  
Then, go to the Insert menu, and choose Image...

### **STUDENT**

Ok, I'm in my glossary in Google Docs and I'm going to find an image to help me understand this word, krill.

So I'll put my cursor in the space I just made.  
Then, I'll go to Insert > Image...

### **TEACHER**

Now, you should see a popup window that looks like this...  
Click Google Image Search (its on the left side of popup window), and type your word in the search box.

### **STUDENT**

Ok, I'm going to choose Google Image Search  
...and type krill, then click the blue search button.  
Wow, look at all these great images!

### **TEACHER**

Now you're ready to choose an image to add to your glossary. Scroll through the images that come up to find one that helps you best understand the meaning of the word. Choose a good one and then press the *Select* button in the bottom right corner.

**STUDENT**

Ok, I am looking through all the images I found, but some of these don't help at all.

Here is a good one. I think this picture helps me see how small krill are. So, I am going to choose this one and then press the Select button.

**TEACHER**

Great – that is exactly how to add an image to your glossary.

Now you are ready for step 3 of the Illustrating your Glossary strategy – Resize and Repeat.
